



#### FIRST PRESEASON GAME AT U.S. BANK STADIUM

THE DAWNING OF A NEW ERA IN VIKINGS FOOTBALL STARTS AT NOON TODAY.

After a journey that included two seasons of home games in the elements at the University of Minnesota, the Vikings are launching a new voyage inside U.S. Bank Stadium, a climate-controlled space with an outdoor feel.

This 1.75-million-square-foot facility is nearly twice the size of its predecessor, the 900,000-square-foot Metrodome.

The Vikings became the first team in a temporary stadium to host a playoff game, the coldest in franchise history at minus-6° Fahrenheit this past January.

This facility's design was born from harsh elements and boldly built for the Vikings fans who will bring it to life.

#### PLAYER TO WATCH: CB TRAE WAYNES

WAYNES WILL SEE GOOD FRIEND and former high school teammate, Chargers running back Melvin Gordon, as a foe for the second time in their young careers. The 11th overall pick of the 2015 NFL Draft, Waynes is the highest-drafted defensive back by the Vikings in franchise history and is one of three players in Minnesota's secondary who was selected in a first round from 2012-15, joining Harrison Smith and Xavier Rhodes. After adjusting to the differences in the amount of contact allowed by NFL officials compared to college officials, Waynes closed his rookie campaign strong and has built momentum for 2016 after nabbing the first interception of his pro career in the Wild Card game against Seattle in January.

TRIFECTA: IN ADDITION TO BEING AN ALL-STATE AND ALL-REGION AS A SENIOR IN 2010, WAYNES WAS SELECTED ALL-COUNTY IN BASEBALL AFTER HITTING .452, AND HE FINISHED THIRD IN THE 100 METERS WITH A TIME OF 10.7 SECONDS AT THE 2011 DIVISION I STATE TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Waynes led the Vikings in special teams tackles with 14, including eight solo stops, in 2015. He excelled with a combination of speed and determination to race down the field and defeat blocks while working as a gunner and helping the Vikings limit opponents to 5.2 yards per punt return.



#### PLAYER TO WATCH: OB PHILIP RIVERS

THE THIRD PRESEASON GAME is generally one in which the starters play the deepest into a game, which could give the Vikings a pretty good look from Rivers, who has a career completion percentage of 64.8 and 41,447 passing yards. Rivers is entering his 13th season with San Diego. Rivers received an unfriendly welcome on his last trip to Minnesota, when the Vikings recorded 4.0 sacks and 13 quarterback hits that were tallied by press box statisticians. Everson Griffen led the barrage with 1.5 sacks and six hits on Rivers, who is known for his resiliency, in the Vikings 31-14 victory in Week 3 last season.

LEAGUE LEADER: THE CHARGERS TURNED TO RIVERS OFTEN
IN 2015, AND HE LED THE LEAGUE IN COMPLETIONS (437) AND
ATTEMPTS (661). RIVERS ALSO HAS LED THE LEAGUE IN COMPLETION
PERCENTAGE (69.5 IN 2013), PASSING YARDS (4,710 IN 2010),
TOUCHDOWN PASSES (34 IN 2008), INTERCEPTIONS (18 IN 2014),
YARDS PER COMPLETION (13.4 IN 2009), PASSER RATING (105.5 IN
2008) AND YARDS LOST VIA SACKS (311 IN 2012).

Rivers has 281 career touchdown passes against 135 interceptions. The ratio of more than 2:1 touchdowns to interceptions is a major factor in his career passer rating of 95.5.

A CENTRAL TENET of Vikings Head Coach Mike Zimmer's coaching philosophy is "do your job, so the guy next to you can do his."

Zimmer will be doing his for the foreseeable future thanks to a contract extension that was announced the day that the Vikings reported to Minnesota State University, Mankato for 2016 Verizon Vikings Training Camp.

"I feel very, very fortunate to be the coach of the Vikings," Mike Zimmer said. "It's a

great organization with a lot of great people. There's no reason we could have the success that we've had to this point without the help of the people in the front office and in the business. It's good to get that done and get a chance to move forward."

Zimmer and the Vikings are preparing for his third season at the helm. The team has an opportunity to defend the NFC North title the Vikings claimed with an 11-5 mark a year ago.

General Manager Rick Spielman, who led the exhaustive search that resulted in Zimmer's first opportunity to be a head coach, announced the extension to members of the media. He recalled the initial conversation and how the relationship has continued to improve.

"We talked about philosophy, we put a plan in place and had the same vision," Spielman said. "In my 26 years in the NFL, I have not had the experience and cohesiveness with the head coach as I do with Coach Zimmer. We're all in this business here to win championships. It's why we come to training camp and what our focus is each year.

"Our ownership deserves a championship. our fans deserve a championship, and there's no doubt in our organization's mind that Coach Zimmer is the right leader for this football team heading into the future," Spielman added.

Zimmer joked that he and Spielman are like "The Odd Couple."

"He's messy, and I'm the clean one," Zimmer said. "Rick's a football guy, and we're able to talk about football and a lot of things.

"We're able to discuss things openly, we're able to sit down," Zimmer said. "Honestly, we haven't had hardly any differences where we've had disagreements. We're both kind of pointed in the way we tease people and things like that. It's been a real good relationship, and I look forward to more."



The longtime defensive coordinator is 18-14 in his first two regular seasons, tallying the second-most number of wins behind Dennis Green's total of 20 from 1992-93.

In a short time, Zimmer has rebuilt a defense that ranked near the bottom of the league in 2013. He guided the Vikings through difficult circumstances in 2014 and continued to climb in league rankings.

The Vikings were fifth in points allowed per game (18.9) in 2015, the fourth time in five seasons in which a Zimmer defense has ranked that high.

Vikings Owner/President Mark Wilf said the organization is "very excited about the direction of our football team with Mike Zimmer as our head coach."

"His leadership and the strong partnership he has with Rick Spielman have helped transform the culture of our football team," Wilf said. "They have established a positive identity for this team with tough-minded, disciplined and smart football players, and we believe Mike's continued leadership bodes very well for our future."

Minnesota also was the least penalized team in the NFL, reflecting the head coach's dedication to details and discipline.

Now, Zimmer will turn his attention to what he loves most: helping players improve and reached for new goals.

"What pushes me is someone else could come and take my job or we don't play as good as we can play, or you know, proving people wrong," Zimmer said. "That's just my mentality."

#### MORF RF-SIGNINGS

Mike Zimmer wasn't the only one to receive a contract extension or re-sign with the Minnesota Vikings.

Harrison Smith inked a multiyear deal in June with the pen he used to sign his rookie deal with the Vikings in 2012.

Smith said he appreciated the opportunity from "the entire Wilf family, Zygi and Mark, Rob Brzezinski, Coach Zimmer and all the players, the guys I want to play with and win championships with, and all the fans."

"I couldn't imagine a better place to play and a better organization to be a part of," Smith said. "I just can't say enough how blessed I am to stay here."

Fresh off his first Pro Bowl, Smith, 27, rode the bus from Winter Park to training camp with Vikings first-year players.

The Vikings also re-signed Matt Asiata, Audie Cole, Kenrick Ellis, Rhett Ellison, Chad Greenway, Mike Harris, Terence Newman, Andrew Sendejo, Marcus Sherels and Justin Trattou before or after free agency began in March.

#### NEW IN TOWN

The Vikings targeted Alex Boone early in free agency, bolstering the offensive line with the 6-foot-8 left guard. Minnesota also added veteran right tackle Andre Smith and linebacker Emmanuel Lamur, who were both members of the Bengals for parts of Zimmer's run as Cincinnati's defensive coordinator. Safety Michael Griffin came to the Vikings after nine seasons with the Titans, along with tight end Brian Leonhardt, a Minnesota native who has spent time with the Raiders and 49ers.

#### LOCAL FLAVOR

Leonhardt is one of seven players born in Minnesota on the Vikings roster, joining Adam Thielen, Sherels, Carter Bykowski, Isaac Fruechte, C.J. Ham and Terrell Sinkfield.

#### CLASS IN SESSION

The Vikings selected four offensive players and four defensive players in the 2016 NFL Draft, tabbing WR Laquon Treadwell, CB Mackensie Alexander, G Willie Beavers, LB Kentrell Brothers, WR Moritz Böhringer, TE David Morgan, DE Stephen Weatherly and S Jayron Kearse.

#### COACHING CHANGES

Zimmer made a few changes to his coaching staff but was able to maintain general continuity with his staff. He slid Kevin Stefanski from coaching tight ends to running backs and brought in two assistants with previous head coaching experience, hiring Pat Shurmur to coach tight ends and Tony Sparano to coach the offensive line. Zimmer also hired Brent Salazar as head strength and conditioning coach.



Greenway made it to the end zone that day. He's aiming for much more than that in 2016, his 11th and what could be his final - run with the Vikings. After finishing last season 11-5, reclaiming the NFC North title and making a playoff appearance, the team wants to go the distance this season.

"We understood what it took to get there," Greenway said. "We know what intensity it took, we know what type of dedication it took, and we need to learn from those experiences to know that we can also do that again this year, and then some - take it to the next level.

"It's going to take everything we've done and then a little more," he added.

While Greenway knows he can't take last year's success for granted, he also feels the Vikings are poised to defend the North - and that's his mentality heading into the season.

"It's been laid out in front of us - the path that we took last year - that we know we can do those things," Greenway said.

As a veteran still studying the game, Greenway said he and his teammates know why 2015's losses were losses and wins were wins. There were things to correct and improve, and the linebacker spent his offseason focusing on those areas.

"The tough situations - the two-minute situations, the end-of-game situations - that we were good and bad at last year really defined our season," Greenway said. "We need to understand that as a team, and we've gone through that this offseason to learn from that and catapult us into a new beginning in 2016 and hopefully more wins."

Greenway embraced a revised role in 2015, willing to do whatever was necessary to help the team succeed. He finished with 86 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and the memorable interception - the sixth longest return by a linebacker in NFL history.

The 33-year-old is still going strong, and it hasn't gone unnoticed.

"Chad has had one of his better camps," Vikings General Manager Rick Spielman said. "It's amazing the shape he came in and the mission that he's on."

Greenway's mission is to bring a Super Bowl trophy to Minnesota. His quest has spanned 10 seasons and three different fields. He played eight seasons in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome before braving the elements for consecutive seasons outdoors at the University of Minnesota. As a grand finale, today marks Greenway's first game in the Vikings brand new home at U.S. Bank Stadium.

Each has held its share of memories - from the crowd noise and nostalgia in the Dome, to hot wins in frigid temps at the U of M, to ushering in a new era of Vikings football.

"It's been fun on every level," Greenway said. "We just heard the noise [at the Metrodome]. It was such a home-field advantage for us."

He went on to emphasize that the Vikings created history in 2015 by being the first team to make it to the playoffs in a temporary stadium.

"We overcame some obstacles there, but we understood what it was going to take to do that," Greenway said. "And now to move in to our new digs at U.S. Bank [Stadium] is going to be so sweet.

"A guy like myself who's going to live in the Twin Cities after my career is done, it's so great for our community to have something like that to bring in big events, and we can show off our city for what it is," Greenway added. "And to get a chance to play in there is going to be incredible."

Just over 10 years ago, Greenway sat surrounded by friends and family at his parents' farmhouse in Mt. Vernon, South Dakota. When he picked up the landline phone to hear he'd be drafted by an NFL team just 313 miles from his hometown, little did he know the career he'd have.

Now, after three stadiums, three head coaches, 140 games, 1,289 tackles, a charity foundation and three daughters with a fourth on the way, Greenway couldn't imagine calling anywhere else home.

"I honestly think Chad is one of the most popular Vikings in the history of the organization," said KFAN's "Voice of the Vikings" Paul Allen. "He's from the Midwest, he lives in Minnesota, he's proud to live here, With 50 years of innovation behind us, we look to the next 50 years to change the future of sports fuel.

he'll raise his kids here – even after his career is done. He's been a tackling machine on the field, and he has longevity. Chad definitely will go down in history."

When Greenway lines up for the first time at U.S. Bank Stadium, for his likely last run in purple and gold, he wants to soak it all in, make every snap count. Above anything, however, he wants to enjoy himself.

"I don't think it's going to be emotional – I think it's going to be fun," Greenway said. "I think it's going to be living it up every minute." He showed this in Seattle when he hoisted Minnesota native Marcus Sherels over his shoulder after the Vikings cornerback returned an interception 53 yards for a touchdown to help Minnesota defeat Seattle 18-11. It was a preseason game that won't count in the standings, but yet another memorable moment.

Whether it's the grind of summer training camp or the ups and downs of a 17-week season, the fun of football has never been lost on Greenway. And he said it all boils down to the camaraderie in the locker room, an irreplaceable brotherhood.

"You know, you could have a guy that grew up in the country in South Dakota like myself and went to lowa, to a guy that grew up in a city on the East Coast, and they have nothing really in common," Greenway said. "But then for them to be in the locker room together, fighting for one goal – I think it's a unique perspective on life, professional sports, for that reason.

"The cultural divide is seemingly nonexistent, because we come together and form this team that really comes across from all different walks of life," Greenway said. "It's what makes it so fun to be a part of it, and it's the thing that you'll miss the most."

Three weeks ago, Greenway once again sat surrounded by family – this time, on the field at Blakeslee Stadium in Mankato, following the night training camp practice. Beside him sat his wife, Jenni, and his daughters – Maddyn, Beckett and Blakely – waiting to take in the post-practice fireworks show. The three girls each wore a variation of Greenway's jersey, with "Daddy" spelled out over the 52.

Moments before, Greenway ran through a mini practice with his daughters, already little athletes taking after their parents. He rotated through a pair of human JUGS machines, snagging footballs slung at him by Maddyn and Beckett. Blakely, not yet 2 years old, toddled – quite quickly – after the group in yellow Converse sneakers.

Greenway rested there on the 10-yard line, but only for a moment. He's ready for number 11.

"I'm here to cherish every moment, knowing it could be your last, and just enjoy the ride," Greenway said. "It's been such an unbelievable career and experience so far. I'm just looking to continue and expand on it."

Chad Greenway's family swelled to more than 500 boys and girls in July when he hosted his annual "Day to REACH Camp" in Hutchinson.

Greenway stepped into the mix in linebacker drills, made a diving one-handed catch as a receiver and scaled a mobile climbing wall.

He was part proud papa and part older brother, interacting with the young people who have grown to admire him. Some of the youth don't know the Vikings without Greenway, who is preparing for his 11th season.

The camp emphasizes character development and education about proper nutrition under the direction of Hutchinson strength and conditioning coach and REACH program director Chad Harlander. REACH stands for Relationships, Education, Accountability, Character and Hard work.

"We talk about character in this camp ... we talk about pushing ourselves back there through all the obstacles," Greenway said. "Things you guys did in this camp, those are going to take you a lot further than just in football or sports."

Harlander said he and the town of Hutchinson appreciate Greenway's selfless help in the community.

In addition to the camps, Greenway attended the inaugural REACH Conference this spring and opened one of his seven "Chad's Lockers" programs at Hutchinson Health to benefit young hospital patients and their families.

In recognition of Greenway's commitment to Hutchinson, Mayor Gary Forcier surprised Greenway with a framed key to the city.

"Thank you for being a great role model for all of our kids," Forcier said.

A NEW HOME FOR VIKINGS GAME DAYS HAS RISEN. THE WESTERN PROW OF U.S. BANK STADIUM JUTS SHARPLY — MORE THAN 270 FEET — INTO THE SKY, ANGLED WALLS OF GLASS REVERSE IMAGES OF TALLER AND SMALLER BUILDINGS. AS WELL AS THE SURROUNDING CITYSCAPE THAT HAS ENTERED A TRANSFORMATIVE PERIOD

This venue is a place to honor tradition and establish new rituals, as well as an agent of change and a reflection of Minnesota. It is an iconic tribute to this area's heritage, an innovative response to its climate and a geometrical gem that will impact blocks of cityscape and the skyline for generations.

From families who have been in the region for centuries to newly welcomed Minnesotans, the boldly designed, 1.75-million square foot building - the largest public/private construction project in state history - offers an intersection of Midwest modesty and hometown pride in a grandiose vet intimate way.

"The stadium is a reflection of Minnesota in a couple of ways," said Richard Davis, Chairman and CEO of U.S. Bank Stadium, "First of all, it's remarkable. It's mouth-opening and aweinspiring. Minnesota is more like that than


anyone knows. We just don't brag about it.

"The stadium reflects this wonderful organization called Minnesota, where people are proud," Davis said. "It's got this whole, true North feel, the Vikings edge, and I think is really going to be a nice testament to the people and the core character of all of us who live here."

#### A SHIP'S VOYAGE

The voyage of this building began with architects from Texas-based HKS making trips around the State of Minnesota and a thorough exploration of Nordic architecture.

The collection of what they found - and how it guided the design – stunned State Sen. Julie Rosen, who drafted the legislation that passed in the senate to fund the \$1.1 billion multipurpose venue that can host 66,200 fans on Vikings game days.

"They found a common theme. whether it was the waterfalls or the Scandinavian architecture, they had these images and started slapping them on top of each other and came up with this drawing of this iconic Vikings ship," Rosen said. "That was an astounding moment for me, 'This is going to be so unique, just as unique as our museums, our galleries.' We all have a unique way about us here in this state."

The decision to turn away from a retractable roof pushed the lines of U.S. Bank Stadium steeper into the sky - to shed snow effectively – and led to a signature feature. The ridgeline of the roof is 272 feet tall at the tip of the western prow, sloping down to the east wall that is 205 feet tall.

The use of a much lighter, transparent ETFE material to cover 60 percent of the roof created a giant skylight that invites the sun into the building. The ETFE and use of glass elsewhere creates an outdoor feeling in a space that will be climate controlled and shielded from the harsh elements that are part of Minnesota's identity. The ETFE also saved an estimated 2,000 tons of structural steel that would have been needed to meet snow and wind load requirements.

"Instead, they came up with this design that was very iconic to Minnesota," said Ted Mondale, CEO/ Executive Director of the Minnesota Sports Facilities Authority. "It's about ice shards and lakes and who we are and where we live"

Compound angles created a complexity - an opportunity for more than 8,000 male and female construction workers to show their skills and craftsmanship. They delivered with daily dedication. reaching the substantially complete milestone six weeks ahead of schedule.

"There's a lot of things that are new here, and people are going to really love it, but it was all themed together as being Minnesotan and reflecting our heritage and values," Mondale said.



#### 'THINK OF ... THE LEGACIES'

U.S. Bank Stadium's Legacy Gates on its west end are five of the world's largest pivoting glass doors. Each door is 55 feet wide, contains 10 standard-sized doors and weighs 57,000 pounds. The gates slope from 95 feet in height at the tallest and northernmost edge to 75 feet.

The Legacy Gates are the portals between a family room unlike any other and a gathering lawn of public plaza and greenspaces that will be transformed into a Vikings Village on game days. The team will have the option of keeping open the gates on nice days, increasing the stadium's connection to the East Town Neighborhood that it is helping transform.

Vikings Owner/President Mark Wilf said the indoor-outdoor feel accomplished by the ETFE roof and glass doors is his favorite element of the building. He also likes the connection to the city that is visible through the glass and doors when they are opened.

"What strikes me the most is when you walk in, you're in an indoor venue but you feel the outdoors, and it's got that indoor-outdoor feel ... the entire experience is special," Wilf said. "You know where you are at all times, you know the weather, you know you're in the City of Minneapolis, but at the same time, you're in the comfort of an indoor building, so that's what stands out to me."

Former Minneapolis Mayor R.T. Rybak, who was in office when stadium legislation passed, waited to visit the venue until after it reached substantial completion because he wanted to wait for the "wow factor."

"This is our living room," Rybak said of the entire stadium that feels more like an arena. Rybak also has noticed the front, side and back vards, if you will.

He said he believes there's "a seamless connection" between the stadium and the surrounding community.

"No other football stadium in America has done that," Rybak said. "More important, no other community in America has rebuilt an entire section of town that has the stadium as a huge part of it, but it's much more than the stadium."

Rybak said it was a goal for the project from the beginning, and the investment in The Commons park and \$1 billion in corporate and residential development blend nicely.

"All of that mattered because too often I think these projects feel like some Colossus imposed on the city," Rybak said. "This is a big building, there's no doubt about it, but it's woven in in a pretty remarkable way. I think that is about architecture and urban design, but it's about more. It's about who feels they belong and how the growth in a facility like this helps grow the rest of the town."

Davis said U.S. Bank's decision to agree to a 20year naming rights contract is a way that the fifthlargest commercial bank in the country can continue to elevate its national and global platform and show pride in its hometown. He equated the landmark status of the building to the Gateway Arch in St. Louis or the Eiffel Tower in Paris.

"What's even more fun is what happens inside though. Think of the stories, the legacies we'll build here and the memories that will be created ... over decades here.

"We're excited about that part, but then you think about the iconic nature of placing into this city, what I'm most proud of, is what it's done for this part of this city," Davis said. "The gentrification is indescribable, and when people come and visit, they'll be taken by the stadium itself and look around and see this amazing Commons, the park, the businesses, the new apartments and condos being built and this connectivity to the city."

Star Tribune reporter Rochelle Olson has covered the stadium, from years of funding proposals in the legislature to the ribbon cutting and beyond. Olson, who worked Vikings and Twins games at Metropolitan Stadium when she was in high school also has had an up-close view the stadium's construction during her commute to work.

"This building really stands out on the skyline as well. It's a significant piece of the Minneapolis skyline now," Olson said. "It's a

distinguishing figure, a distinguishing landmark that sort of joins the Stone Arch Bridge and the Mississippi River, the IDS building and Target Field if you're shooting an aerial shot. It's much bigger, much more distinctive, going to have much more identity with the city."

#### FOCUS ON FANS

Cory Merrifield, a passionate lifelong Vikings fan who founded Save the Vikes, organized grass roots support for the stadium by enabling fans to communicate their passion and support for the stadium with their legislators.

"I travel all over this country, and when people I meet talk about Minnesota, they talk about three things: how cold it is here, we have the Mall of America and the Minnesota Vikings," said Merrifield, a Season Ticket Holder.

Merrifield is excited for other families to be able to share their love for the team the way his grandfather,

father and uncle did, as well as the multitude of other events that U.S. Bank Stadium will host.

"I often think back to a time when I was younger, back in the late 80s, early 90s when Raiders gear was kind of taking off. I went home with a Raiders hat," Merrifield remembered. "My uncle said, 'There's only one color and only one team in this family, and that's the Minnesota Vikines.'"

Wilf said the design and plans were guided by an overarching goal of putting fan experiences first.

"Any decision, any design element, any technology decision was always about making sure the fan experience would be number one, and I think we've accomplished that," Wilf said. "It's been a long journey to get to this point, but seeing now and knowing how fans all over the world will be able to experience this building gives us at the Vikings, our entire organization and ownership a great deal of pride and pleasure that this is going to be a legacy for generations to come."

Vikings Dedicate Sid Hartman Media Entrance at U.S. Bank Stadium

Sid Hartman covered the arrival of the Minnesota Vikings.

Now, the legendary reporter will lend his name to a special part of their state-of-theart home as a new era unfolds.

The Vikings officially dedicated the Sid Hartman Media Entrance at U.S. Bank Stadium on Tuesday.

Vikings Executive Vice President of Public Affairs and Stadium Development Lester Bagley explained to family, friends and leaders of the Twin Cities sports scene in attendance that the entrance is a fitting tribute to "someone we truly love."

"Every media member, locally, nationally, internationally at the Super Bowl and every other event we have here," Bagley said, "when they come to this building, they'll come through the Sid Hartman Media Entrance and tip their cap to Sid as we do on a daily basis."

Hartman had an initial scoop on the NFL. He was born in Minneapolis on March 15, 1920, six months and two days before a group of men met in Canton, Ohio, to lay the foundation for what would develop into the professional football league.

Vikings Hall of Fame Coach Bud Grant dubbed himself "the original 'Sid Hartman's close personal friend' " before he recalled



first meeting Hartman at a basketball game in the Twin Cities when Grant was stationed at Naval Station Great Lakes near Chicago.

Fate brought them back together when Grant enrolled at the University of Minnesota, where he played basketball. football and baseball.

The men dined together on 99-cent bowls of spaghetti in Dinkytown. The relationship continued when Grant played for the Minneapolis Lakers, when Grant became head coach of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and again when Grant returned to Minnesota in 1967. Grant totaled 11 division titles and four Super Bowl appearances in his 18 seasons with the Vikings, and Hartman covered them all.

"Of all the people I've known in this world, he has more integrity than anybody I've ever known," Grant said. "That's why he has so many friends, that's why so many people are here and that's why we're here today."

Vikings Executive Director of Public Relations Bob Hagan recalled meeting Hartman for the first time a quarter century

"When I started at the Vikings in 1991, Sid was a young, 71-year-old reporter," Hagan said. "He still has the same great work ethic that he had as a youngster, something that all of us in this room can learn from."

Vikings Chief Operating Officer Kevin Warren said Hartman is "an incredible, iconic figure."

"He's critical when he needs to be, but we know at the end of the day that his heart is in the right place," Warren said. "He's an

absolutely wonderful man. We all can only hope and pray that we're in as good of a position that he is at his age."

Attendees included former Vikings Head Coach Jerry Burns, Vikings historian and original athletic trainer Fred Zamberletti, Vikings Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer Steve Poppen, Vikings General Manager Rick Spielman, Vikings Assistant General Manager George Paton, Vikings Executive Vice President of Football Operations Rob Brzezinski. Vikings Ring of Honor Member Scott Studwell, Vikings consultant Paul Wiggin and former defensive end Bob Lurtsema, as well as University of Minnesota President Eric Kaler, Twins President Dave St. Peter. Timberwolves President Chris Wright and Minnesota hockey icon Lou Nanne.

Vikings Owner/Chairman Zygi Wilf and Owner/President Mark Wilf phoned Hartman to express their congratulatory words

The secret to Hartman's success? "I love what I do, and that's why I have fun," he said.






