THROUGH-THE-LENS

VIKINGS AT PANTHERS

THE VIKINGS UPENDED THE DEFENDING NFC CHAMPION PANTHERS AND SNAPPED CAROLINA'S 14-GAME HOME WIN STREAK THAT DATED TO 2014 WITH A 22-10 VICTORY IN WEEK 3.

Minnesota sacked reigning NFL MVP Cam Newton eight times and intercepted him three times for a passer rating of 47.6 (the fourth-lowest of his career). The Vikings offense, defense and special teams units combined to score the game's final 22 points.

Everson Griffen fought through an illness and recorded 3.0 sacks of Cam Newton. Griffen has 26.5 sacks since 2014, which is the fourth-most in the NFL.

Linval Joseph recorded a sack for the third consecutive game. It was one of eight takedowns of Newton.



Kyle Rudolph led the Vikings with seven catches for 70 yards, including this 15-yard touchdown reception from Sam Bradford.

Tom Johnson recorded his first career interception, corralling a floating pass that was forced with pressure by Griffen.

A MATCHUP PRIMED FOR MONDAY NIGHT

THE VIKINGS WILL TRY TO EXTEND THEIR REGULAR-SEASON WINNING STREAK TO SEVEN GAMES IN TONIGHT'S MATCHUP WITH THE GIANTS.

MINNESOTA IS 15-12 ALL-TIME in the series (14-10 in regular-season games) and has won five of the past seven, including a 49-17 contest last December that clinched the Vikings first postseason berth since 2012.

Ben McAdoo was promoted to replace Tom Coughlin as head coach after spending the past two seasons as New York's offensive

coordinator. Prior to that, McAdoo was an assistant with Green Bay (TEs 2006-11; OBs, 2012-13).

Eli Manning is back for his 13th season. Manning has thrown for 925 yards with four touchdowns and three picks so far this season. The two-time Super Bowl MVP, who is 3-5 in his career against the Vikings, has thrown for 45,112 yards and 298 touchdowns in his 13-season career. Manning ranks 10th all-time in passing yards and eighth in passing touchdowns.

Manning is 3-5 against the Vikings, completing 132 of 244 passes (54.1 percent) for 1,445 yards with five touchdowns and 14 interceptions for a rating of 54.8.

NFL PLAY 60

The NFL Play 60 movement encourages young people to participate in physical activity for 60 minutes a day and make healthy lifestyle and nutritional choices. Local youth groups will be on the field before tonight's game during the National Anthem.

PLAYER TO WATCH: WR STEFON DIGGS

STEFON DIGGS' SPEED, QUICKNESS AND SMOOTHNESS in changing directions play a factor in his ability to create separation from defenders. He is leading the Vikings with 20 receptions for 325 yards (16.3 yards per reception) with a long of 46 yards and had a 25-yard touchdown against Green Bay. The second-year pro posted career highs of nine catches and 182 yards to power the Vikings past the Packers. Diggs tracked a deep toss from Sam Bradford for a 44-yard play, then showed ability to turn a short completion into a substantial gain. He entered Week 4 second in the NFL in receiving yards this season.

ELITE COMPANY: DIGGS WAS INACTIVE AS A ROOKIE FOR THE FIRST SCENE. THROUGH THREE GAMES THIS SEASON, HIS YARDS PER RECEPTION IS UP FROM 13.8 TO 16.3, AND HIS CATCH PERCENTAGE IS UP FROM 61.9 TO 74.1 PERCENT. IN WEEK 2, HE BECAME THE FIRST VIKINGS PLAYER SINCE RANDY MOSS TO HAVE MORE THAN 180 RECEIVING YARDS AND AT LEAST ONE TOUCHDOWN IN A GAME.

Diggs played his 16th regular-season game last week at Carolina. In the equivalent of a full NFL season, the former fifth-round pick has totaled 72 receptions for 1,045 yards (14.5 yards per reception) and five touchdowns. He has been targeted a total of 110 times by Vikings quarterbacks.

PLAYER TO WATCH: ODELL BECKHAM. JR.

THE 12TH OVERALL PICK of the 2014 NFL Draft out of LSU has made quite the splash and some dazzling catches in his first two-plus seasons. Beckham's pregame warmup usually draws a crowd of fans because of his interesting routine, and he's generally noted at all times by defenses. He posted 121 yards on seven catches last week against Washington and will face a defense that hasn't allowed a receiver 100 yards this season but did allow five in 2015. In 30 games, Beckham became the fastest player to reach 200 receptions (206) and 3,000 yards (3,035). He also has 25 touchdowns.

THROWING HIS WAY: BECKHAM HAS BEEN TARGETED A TOTAL OF 318 TIMES (10.6 PER GAME) AND HAS CAUGHT PASSES 64.8 PERCENT OF THE TIME. HIS SINGLE-GAME HIGH WAS 21 TARGETS AGAINST PHILADELPHIA IN THE 2014 REGULAR-SEASON FINALE. AND HIS LOW IS TWO AGAINST THE EAGLES EARLIER THAT SEASON. ELI MANNING THREW TOWARD BECKHAM EIGHT TIMES IN THE SEASON OPENER AND THEN 11 TIMES IN EACH OF THE PAST TWO WEEKS.

Beckham has played in 30 regular-season games and recorded 100 or more receiving yards 16 times. The Giants are 6-10 in games in which Beckham has hit the century mark. Beckham posted four straight games with 100 or more to cap his rookie season and put together a streak of six in a row in 2015.

THE PAIR OF DEFENSIVE BACKS roam the secondary on game days for Head Coach Mike Zimmer's defense, rarely in the same place on consecutive snaps but always knowing where the other is.

They say that comes from extensive film study, an area they've ingrained into their preparation, using technology to connect outside of the team's headquarters.

"Usually during the week while we're studying or prepping, if I see a play or Harry sees a play that could potentially give us some problems, we'll video it and send it to each other," Sendejo said. "We'll say, 'Well how do you see us playing this versus this coverage,' or, 'What would you do in this?'

"Sometimes I'm watching a certain game, and he's watching a certain game, and we see stuff that the other doesn't see," Sendejo added. "We just kind of send it to each other and figure it out then, or the next day we'll talk about it."

Smith, who earned his first Pro Bowl selection in 2015, said the communication has grown in recent years. Both players signed multiyear extensions this offseason.

"It's gotten more and more (frequent) the more we've played together because it's hard to watch every play of the team you're playing," Smith said. "We don't sit there and say, 'I'll watch this, and you watch this.'

"We talk through what we're going to do with it," he added. "It really helps because it keeps you one step ahead."

Zimmer has noticed how well Smith and Sendejo have worked together.

"I think they communicate well," Zimmer said. "Almost all the time, they're in the right place.

"They help a lot of guys get lined up," he added. "They play real hard and physical, so it's been a good tandem."

The duo first met in 2012, when Smith was a first-round pick out of the University of Notre Dame. Sendejo, an undrafted free agent out of Rice University, had just completed his first season in Purple.

They didn't play together much at first, as Sendejo worked his way up from a key special teams contributor to starting at safety last season.

Along the way, Smith and Sendejo have formed a bond and a trust that is nearly unbreakable.

The results have been there, too.

Although Smith and Sendejo each missed a few games due to injuries in 2015, they started 11 games next to each other. Add in the first three games of the 2016 season, and the Vikings have compiled an impressive 12-2 record when the duo started next to each other in the secondary.

They also helped anchor a defense that allowed just 18.9 points per game last season, good for fifth in the league.

"We both hold each other accountable," Sendejo said. "We both know the work that the other puts in during the week to be prepared for the game.

"I know that when I need help from Harry on a certain coverage, I know he's going to be there, and he knows that I'm going to be there," he added. "It allows us to play well together."

Smith said their connection stems from practices, meetings and games. But the quick text messages during a week of game-planning also come in handy.

"If we're not on the same page, it's not going to be good," Smith said. "There's time where I'll be stuck, and he'll say something and get me in the right spot.

"Stuff like that happens a lot because the game is so fast," he added. "Things happen so quick, so you have to have both of us keeping each other in check."

Smith and Sendejo's bond has even branched out to nonfootball activities.

Smith is involved with Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Twin Cities and hosts an annual kickball game for "Bigs" and "Littles" at Winter Park.

Likewise, Smith had Sendejo's back in June when Sendejo rappelled down a 38-story building in Austin, Texas, to raise funds and awareness for the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

"Somebody had to be there in case he fell off," Smith quipped. "But it was pretty cool, him hanging off a side of a building."

The friendship between the safeties also extends to other defensive backs. Smith and Sendejo showed up to support Vikings cornerback Xavier Rhodes at his annual charity bowling event earlier this year.

"Just showing up for each other ... offense, defense, whatever, but especially within the DB room," Smith said. "You've got to have that (support system) back there

because you're going to go through adversity.

"You've got to stick together and fight for one another," he added.

Sendejo estimated the pair spends dozens of hours together during the week before going home and keeping in touch with their phones or iPads.

The 29-year-old Sendejo noted he likes to put on some music and study in 30-minute increments to keep his brain fresh.

And since the two know each other so well, they said they don't need to send long and elaborate messages when getting the other up to speed on a particular coverage, play call or tendency of an opponent.

"A paragraph is way too long," Smith said with a laugh. Added Sendejo: "It's usually just a video with the coverage. Sometimes it's just the video of a play that could be a potential issue depending on what we have going in that week."

The constant communication all adds up to each other being reliable when called upon during games.

"You're kind of quarterbacking the coverage so to speak," Sendejo said. "It's a pretty complex defense as far as what we have in.

"You have to be able to do your job. If you can't do your job or you don't know what you're supposed to be doing, they're not going to put you on the field," he added. "We have to make a lot of checks and adjustments and get the other guys lined up."

It's not all business all the time for Smith and Sendejo, however. The pair noted they look for humorous moments while watching film that they can point out to each other or one of their teammates.

"We'll also keep each other in check," Smith said. "If something funny happened in a game and it's one of us, we'll send that, too, to make sure we know that we saw the other guy mess up.

"But it could be anybody," he added. "No one is safe."

Neither are opposing offenses, it seems, especially when Smith and Sendejo are hard at work behind the scenes.

"It's not like there is an 'Ah-ha' moment or something like that," Smith said. "It's basic adjustments that once you talk through them, they're simple.

"But if we haven't seen them before, they could trip you up," he added. "They are things we notice that make us play faster."

IT'S A GOOD BET that Eli Manning will make sure he knows where Minnesota's safeties are at all times tonight.

When the Vikings hosted New York in Week 16 of the 2015 season, both Harrison Smith and Andrew Sendejo picked off the Giants quarterback.

Those were two of three interceptions thrown by Manning in a game the Vikings won 49-17 to get their 10th win of the season and clinch a berth in the playoffs.

Sendejo said he was so focused on the victory that he hardly realized it was the first game in which he and Smith both had interceptions.

"I didn't really think about the fact that we both had one," Sendejo said.

Sendejo nabbed his pick midway through the first quarter, corralling a deflection of a Manning pass by cornerback Xavier Rhodes before returning it nine yards.

"My pick was pretty easy," Sendejo said. "Xavier had great coverage and tipped it in the air. I just happened to be standing right there.

"Sometimes you get those lucky bounces that come your way ... I was fortunate enough to be there for that one," he added. Smith gave him a bit more credit.

"A lot of times you see guys drop the easy ones," Smith said. "They all count the same."

Smith's interception put points on the board for the Vikings. With just over four minutes left in the second quarter, Smith baited Manning into a throw on the right hashmark. The former first-round selection leapt up and caught the pass before racing 35 yards for the score.

Smith's pick-6 was the fourth of his career, which set a Vikings franchise record. It also gave Minnesota a double-digit lead.

"I remember Harry's pick being at a crucial time," Sendejo said. "It changed the momentum of the game. Obviously, anytime you score on defense, that's huge."

Smith said he was just glad to capitalize on the opportunity. He said defensive backs talk often about how the team's chances to win skyrocket if the defense can create a turnover and find the end zone.

Smith had a comical celebration on the play. As he wound up to throw the ball, it slipped out of his hands.

Sendejo, who said Smith was "way too juiced" after the score, is looking for the first touchdown of his career.

He's been close.

In a 2014 road game against Chicago, Sendejo gained 48 yards on a fake punt but was tackled at the 7-yard line. And against Detroit at home last year, he was tackled by Lions running back Ameer Abdullah on the 6-yard line after scooping up a fumble.

Sendejo, who had two career interceptions entering this season, even had two fumble recoveries in the first two games of 2016.

"We actually have a running joke about me getting into the end zone," Sendejo said. "But I've been knocking at the door.

"Every time we get the ball, the first thing that comes into our head is that we're scoring," he added. "That's our mentality, so hopefully it'll pay off for us soon. We don't always get the ball, so when we do we're going to make the most of it."

Perhaps pay dirt is just on the horizon.

The running back heard his number called in 2014 when the Vikings played nearly the entire season without Adrian Peterson. He finished that season with nine touchdowns.

When Peterson suffered a torn meniscus against the Packers two weeks ago and needed surgery, Asiata was prepared to step up again.

"It's devastating when your friend and teammate goes down," Asiata said, "But me, Jerick [McKinnon] and Zach Line are going to try to hold it down for him."

Asiata and McKinnon shared the load at Carolina in the Vikings first full game

without Peterson, and the trend will likely continue. It isn't uncommon for the Vikings to bring in Asiata for pass protection or in third-down situations, and the hard-working back is prepared to do whatever is asked of him.

"You just have to go in there and execute and do your job," Asiata said. "For me, I just want the whole team to win, so I try to go in there and help pass protect or run the ball, just trying to get down the field and get first downs."

Peterson in the first two games drew extra defensive reinforcements, and Minnesota was challenged in making headway on the ground. Asiata now takes the responsibility on his shoulders to get that part of their game up and running - literally.

"There's always something to improve every day and every week, and that's something as a team we're going to work on, is our running game," Asiata said. "Just go out there and do our best to clean it up."

As the pattern repeated, the tempo increased.

"That was crazy," Vikings cornerback Captain Munnerlyn said. "I didn't know it was going to be that crazy, but when they got it down, I was like, 'Wow. Keep doing it!' And it was great."

Receiver Charles Johnson said he thought the chant was "really cool," especially after fans united their rhythm.

"Some people were offbeat a little bit. but you know, first time, a little rusty," Johnson said with a laugh. "You have to try it out a little bit. I think it was definitely cool to get everybody going like that - it was exciting out there."

The chant is a modified version of the stirring "Vikings War Chant" that swept across the globe when the Icelandic National Soccer Team returned home to 35.000 fans after its upset of England at the Euro 2016.

Vikings Vice President of Content and Production Bryan Harper saw the Icelandic chant in videos and was drawn to it - and he wasn't the only one.

"It was super intimidating, showing people together in unison. Immediately after it, I saw it and people are texting me," Harper said. "Over the course of the next day, we got hundreds of emails from fans, 'We've got to do this,' and we're the only team that can do it.

"This came from the fans. This is the best part about it," Harper added. "When stuff comes from the fans, it's more authentic."

Aron Gunnarsson, the captain of the Icelandic Soccer Team, and Thor Björnsson, who stars as "The Mountain" in Game of Thrones, appeared in a video to help transfer the chant to Vikings fans.

After seeing the response from Vikings fans at the Packers game, Gunnarsson said it was a bit surreal to see the tradition adopted - and adapted - by an NFL team.

"It was pretty special," Gunnarrson told Iceland reporter Eiríkur Stefán Ásgeirsson, as translated through Google Chrome, "You realized that the Viking [Chant] has become [major] and world famous. Therefore [it's] noticed almost wherever [one] goes."

Quarterback Sam Bradford made his Minnesota debut in a game of firsts, and he said he was impressed by the energy of the Vikings fans.

"That's one of the best atmospheres I've probably ever played in," Bradford said. "Our fans were tremendous."

As Bradford continues to lead the Vikings, the team hopes to hear the Vikings SKOL Chant as a regular battle cry. And Minnesota gained one more fan who will be cheering from across the world.

Although he didn't watch much of the NFL beyond the Super Bowl in years past, Gunnarrson said he has no choice but to now join the Purple and Gold.

"It must be so," Gunnarrson said.



Stefon Diggs isn't too far removed from his playground days.

The 22-year-old is in his second season in the NFL after starring at the collegiate and high school levels of football, but he can recall a playground near his grandmother's house where he could just be a kid.

Diggs was pleased to learn about the U.S. Bank Places to Play Program, a three-year, \$1 million investment across Minnesota that awards grant funding to non-profit, neighborhood-based organizations and schools in low- to moderateincome communities to improve the quality, safety and accessibility of local play spaces.

As part of U.S. Bank's "Community Possible" platform, this grantmaking initiative focuses on parks, playgrounds, indoor/outdoor athletic facilities and repairs to existing trails over three years.

The first recipients chosen were Beltrami Neighborhood Council in Minneapolis, Ecolibrium3 in Duluth, Fairmont Area Schools, Family Pathways in North Branch, Joy of the People Foundation in St. Paul, the Trust for Public Land in St. Paul and Urban Ventures Leadership Foundation in Minneapolis.

Diggs, the 2015 Vikings Children's Fund Rookie of the Year, was on hand for the check presentation to the first recipients.

"The Places to Play initiative is important to the Vikings because it's also our community," Diggs said. "It will create big memories for a lot of

The Places to Play Program is evaluating another round of applicants for matching grants that range from \$25,000 to \$50,000.





In order to be eligible for a grant under the program, projects must be sponsored by community-based non-profit organizations registered as exempt from Federal Income Tax under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) or by schools located in or primarily serving low- to moderate-income communities in Minnesota.


Strong preference will be given to those proposals that accomplish the following, in no particular order: (1) seek to upgrade existing facilities that are in poor condition or otherwise underutilized; (2) demonstrate active use of the spaces; (3) attract matching funding that exceeds the minimum required match of 1:1; (4) involve local partnerships with non-profit community partners (e.g., Parks and Recreation departments, YMCA branches, etc.) to promote youth safety and community programming; and (5) provide for continuing maintenance and safety.







A lot has changed since the Minnesota Vikings first began play during the 1961 season. Players have come and gone, new stadiums have been built, and uniforms have been updated. However, one thing that has never changed is the team's iconic horned helmets. From Fran Tarkenton in 1961 to Everson Griffen in 2016, every Vikings player has donned the horned helmets. This week we explore the Truth Behind horned helmets in the Viking Age.

Why do the Minnesota Vikings have horns painted on their helmets? Many believe it's because helmets had horns in the Viking Age. In popular culture, we find them everywhere. The comic *Hägar the Horrible* is just one example. There, helmets with horns are standard; even children, dogs and ducks wear them!

The truth is that Vikings never had horns on their helmets. It would have been very strange if they did. Helmets are defensive weaponry and protect against sword blows. A blade striking a bare helmet glances off. Knobs, on the other hand, absorb the shock into the skull. We have never found any horned helmets from the Viking Age. No contemporary pictures of Viking warriors show horns on their helmets.

The costume designer Carl Emil Doepler designed winged helmets for Richard Wagner's opera series The Ring of the Nibelung in 1876. Doepler then added horns in an 1882 book on Germanic gods and heroes. The horns have become a signature of Viking imagery ever since.

The image of a Viking with horns on the helmet is simply too good to pass up. Even Scandinavians love to wear them, especially as fans of their national sports teams. The horns serve as identification. They also stress the wildness of the Vikings in berserk mood. As such, they fit perfectly on the helmet of the Minnesota Vikings right where they have always been.
