

## VIKINGS



MULTIPLE PLAYERS MADE THEIR VIKINGS DEBUTS ON SATURDAY IN A 42-28 WIN OVER THE BRONCOS.

Kirk Cousins, Trevor Siemian and Kyle Sloter led drives that resulted in touchdowns. The quarterbacks combined to complete 24 of 32 passes (75 percent) for 276 yards and four touchdowns. Sloter also rushed twice for 19 yards and a score. Minnesota's first-team defense only played one series but forced a three-and-punt

by Denver. An interception by Anthony Harris set up the Vikings second touchdown of the night, and an interception by Jack Tocho preceded Minnesota's final touchdown.

The Vikings outgained the Broncos 406 to 299.



**[]** Cousins was 4-of-4 passing for 42 yards with a touchdown for a passer rating of 150.0 in his first game action with the Vikings.

**§2** | Stefon Diggs reeled in this pass from Cousins for a gain of 28 yards. Diggs also caught a 1-yard touchdown pass to cap the first-team offense's only possession.







**[]** Undrafted rookie Roc Thomas caught touchdown passes of 13 and 78 yards from Siemian, who completed 11 of 17 passes for 165 yards and had a passer rating of 111.2.

**[4]** Sloter was 9-of-11 passing for 69 yards and a touchdown for a passer rating of 123.1. He also rushed for a 14-yard touchdown.

TODAY'S GAME FEATURES the defending AFC South Champion Jaguars and NFC North Champion Vikings in the second exhibition contest of 2018 for both teams. Jacksonville and Minnesota each advanced to their respective conference title games last January, coming within one win of playing in Super Bowl LII.

Jacksonville and Minnesota have met just once in the preseason (a 16-14 win by the Jaguars in 2003) and only six times in the

regular season. The Vikings have claimed five of those games, including the past four.

The Vikings new-look offense is directed by quarterback Kirk Cousins, who led a touchdown drive on his only series last week at Denver. The first-team defense, meanwhile, looked like it picked up where it left off a year ago when it led the NFL in yards allowed and points allowed. The Jaguars defense ranked second in both categories last season.






#### **U.S. BANK HOMETOWN HERO**

#### PLAYER TO WATCH: RB MIKE BOONE

SIGNED AS AN UNDRAFTED ROOKIE free agent out of Cincinnati, Boone has an opportunity to compete for a roster spot that opened when Jerick McKinnon signed a multiyear deal with San Francisco. Dalvin Cook and Latavius Murray are set to return for their second seasons with Minnesota, but the Vikings are also building depth at the position. The team will be able to use preseason games to evaluate Boone, who totaled 2,250 yards on 420 carries (5.4 yards per attempt) in four seasons with the Bearcats. Boone added 65 receptions for 596 yards (9.2 yards per reception) and totaled 797 kickoff return yards. After not receiving an invite to the NFL Scouting Combine, Boone turned some heads at the Cincinnati Pro Day, where he recorded a vertical jump of 42 inches and a broad jump of 11 feet, 7 inches. Both would have ranked No. 1 among running backs at the combine.

RECORD SETTER: BOONE GREW UP IN MACCLENNY, FLORIDA, JUST WEST OF JACKSONVILLE. HE PLAYED RECEIVER FOR BAKER COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL, WHERE HE CAUGHT 57 PASSES FOR 1,068 YARDS AND 18 TOUCHDOWNS IN 2013, THAT SENIOR SEASON INCLUDED A SCHOOL-RECORD 211 RECEIVING YARDS IN ONE GAME.

Boone totaled 25 touchdowns (24 rushing, one receiving) in 39 games with the Bearcats. He had nine scores on the ground in his freshman and sophomore seasons in Cincinnati. Initially slated to redshirt in 2014, Boone reached the end zone in seven consecutive games.

#### PLAYER TO WATCH: LB MYLES JACK

JACK IS A FORMER UCLA TEAMMATE of Vikings linebackers Anthony Barr (2013) and Eric Kendricks (2013-14). Despite suffering a torn meniscus during a practice early in his junior season, Jack was selected in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft. He played strongside linebacker in Jacksonville's base defense and kicked inside when the Jaguars shifted to their nickel defense in 2017 but is moving to the middle linebacker spot full-time for the Jaguars in his third pro season. Jack's play helped the Jaguars advance to the AFC Championship Game last January. In three postseason contests, he totaled 19 tackles (league stats), three passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble and a sack.

JACK AS A BACK: JACK TOTALED 68 RUSHING ATTEMPTS FOR 387 YARDS AND 11 TOUCHDOWNS WHEN THE BRUINS UTILIZED HIM AS A RUNNING BACK. HE DID THE BRUNT OF HIS DAMAGE AS A FRESHMAN, RUSHING 38 TIMES FOR 267 YARDS (7.0 YARDS PER CARRY) AND SEVEN TOUCHDOWNS. JACK ALSO TOTALED 75 TACKLES AND A TEAM-BEST 13 PASSES DEFENDED IN 2013

73-IN-79

In addition to totaling 15 tackles for loss during his college career, Jack racked up 23 passes defended in 29 games for the Bruins.

#### How would you say your game has most improved heading into the 2018 season?

. I think my game has improved the most **A.** with take-off from the ball. Last year I was a little heavier, and I lost a little weight. I had a conversation with the coaches, we talked about it. and they feel like under 320 is a good weight for me so I can move better. It's been helping me out. So just trimming down a little bit more, if I know that can help the team and contribute to the team. I'm all with it.

#### • What were the biggest changes you made to arrive at your ideal weight?

**↑.** The biggest thing was avoiding snacks late at  $oldsymbol{h}_{oldsymbol{\cdot}}$  night. I'm a big snack guy, I've always been my whole life. I try not to eat anything past 7:30 or 8 now, but if I do, it's healthy snacks like rice cakes that I know are good and have less calories. ... Then when I'm up here at the facility, I try to eat a lot of stuff with greens in it - I'll have eggs and spinach. I've never had spinach before - but you know, I'm trying it out. It's not that bad. [I had to learn that] you're burning more calories through the day; at night, you're not burning many calories. I had it backwards. I would say, 'I'll eat more at night.' Now I eat a big lunch and a small dinner. That's how I do it.

#### **1.** What is it like practicing against the Vikings defense every day?

A: (Laughing) They're going to cause a lot of problems for offensive coordinators this year. It's a bunch of guys out there who play with a chip on their shoulder, who love to go out there and compete and just love to go out there and grind. Those guys, they don't take plays off. ... They're always competing, and they're always going at it. We feed each off each other as a D-line and O-line. They'll say, 'OK, I got you with that move because you did this." We try to help each other out. We're not independent operators. We all help each other, the offense and defense, which I love.

#### How does being a husband and a father to two daughters, 3 and 7, impact your perspective on the field?

First of all, I know I'm providing for my family.
I always live my life by God, family and then football, which is my job right now. My family is the most important thing to me. My wife, my two little girls, to have them out there with me [at training camp] is amazing. They're always laughing and joking around. When I come home and, you know, it's not always going to be a great day at work, so when you go home, everything like that just goes out the back of your mind, and all I see are my little girls when they run to me and smile. My little 3-year-old, she just goes crazy when she sees me. If I had a bad day, or even if I had a good day, when I go home and see my kids, they always brighten my day.

They've got me wrapped around their finger. ... They're my girls, and I love them. And my wife, she's always there supporting me. I'm glad I've got the family I've got. I'm out here every day - I love the game, I love playing football, and I love being around my family.

## TONY SPARANO

TONY SPARANO'S TRAGIC DEATH BROUGHT SORROW TO THE VIKINGS

ORGANIZATION. HIS TIME WITH THE TEAM WAS BRIEF, BUT HIS

LEGACY WILL LAST WITH PLAYERS, COACHES AND STAFF.

The underside of Tony Sparano's hat contained a succinct but accurate autobiography.

His devotions – faith and family – penned in one location to accompany him on the sidelines during games.

Those fortunate enough to have a close relationship with Tony know that one was never without the other.

Faith guided Tony, influencing the love he bestowed on his family and enabling his leadership of football players, position groups and entire teams.

Family members understood the importance of football to Tony and that the sport would continue to add extended family members. They also knew he had enough love to share.

Tony and his wife, Jeanette, first met on their high school football field in Connecticut. More than three decades later, the former player and cheerleader journeyed to South Florida.

Tony was named head coach of the Miami Dolphins after nine seasons as an NFL assistant in Cleveland, Washington, Jacksonville and Dallas.

Someone in the stands, watching Tony on the sideline, asked Jeanette why her husband would touch the brim of his cap and then his lips.

Jeanette didn't know, so she asked, and Tony explained that he began writing the sign of the

cross and the couple's initials on the underside of his cap on game days.

During her poignant and elegant eulogy, Jeanette told those attending her husband's funeral that he had explained to her, "Before we left the locker room, I would say a prayer and ask God for the strength to face whatever was ahead, I would ask Him to protect the health and safety of our players and the opposing players, and I would thank Him again for allowing me to do what I love. I would touch the cross and our initials on my cap and seal it with a blessing."

More initials followed. T.S. when Anthony M. "Tony" Sparano was born. A.S. when Andrew "Andy" Sparano followed and R.S. when their daughter, Ryan, was born.

"And as we were blessed with more children through our children, R.S. when Rebecca joined our family, L.V. when Liz [Vinish] joined our family and L.C. when Levi [Crocker] joined our family. What a blessing it was for him to have the initials of our precious grandbabies."

Tony's inherent ability as a coach and teacher may only have been exceeded by his instinctive approach to being "Papa" to his grandchildren.

He would tell Jeanette, "This is

really fun. We just get to play with them. We never have to tell them no, and then Tony and Rebecca can be mad at us." Jeanette said it was "so refreshing and beautiful for me to see that Tony has always been simply, perfectly, beautiful Tony," unchanged from the 16-yearold with whom she fell in love. "There was never any artifice or any desire to craft an image," Jeanette said. "He didn't care much what those who didn't know him thought of him, but he cared very deeply that the people in his life knew how much he loved them and how much he respected and cared for them." Head Coach Mike Zimmer brought Sparano to the Vikings family in 2016. The men had worked together for Hall of Fame Head Coach Bill Parcells from 2003-06 in Dallas. (Parcells hired Sparano as Dolphins head coach in 2008).

Zimmer admired the way Tony grinded through work, his ability to teach and his "toughness and fighting spirit that showed in our linemen."

Zimmer also liked a familiar demeanor. "He was always grumpy, a lot like me," Zimmer said during a media session two days before attending his friend's funeral. "He was probably the only person in the building grumpier than I was.

"But he really cared about his players," Zimmer continued, his voice cracking with emotion. "I've sat in with him in the offensive line rooms a lot. He had a way of poking a stick at the guys and then putting his arm around them."

Vikings General Manager Rick Spielman said he saw Tony's influence take effect in a short period of time.

"I used to kid him all the time – 'It's like watching a bunch of Tony Sparanos running around the building,' " Spielman quipped, bringing a moment of levity to a piercingly emotional media session. "I mean, they're

all in that mode. I do think the group that we have, they'll want to rally. I know they'll want to make him proud as we move forward."

Second-year pro Pat Elflein said Tony "made me a better player and a better man."

"He took me to places I couldn't go as a player and as a man," Elflein said. "It wasn't just football with him. He really cared about his players, the well-being of his players. It hurts."

Veteran left tackle Riley Reiff, who joined the Vikings in 2017, said, "Tony loved us. Tony loved his family. I can't say enough about the guy. He was a good, genuine guy, and he cared about people."

Reiff said the tragedy is an opportunity for the Vikings to use a tough situation to strengthen the bond that Tony helped build.

Zimmer opted to fill the void from within his staff, moving tight ends coach Clancy Barone to join assistant offensive line coach Andrew Janocko as co-offensive line coaches. Zimmer then shifted senior offensive assistant Todd Downing to tight ends.

Barone and Janocko said they are comfortable working together and adjusting to the new setup. They yearned for their old roles because it would mean Tony would be with the team and his family.

"I lost a very good friend, and there are people who lost a very good husband and father and grandfather," Barone said. "That's my focus. If I was coaching tight ends, it would be a much better place for a lot of people."

The move to make Barone and Janocko cooffensive line coaches helped with continuity. They are two voices with one message that has been impacted by Tony.

"The great thing about it is that Tony and I always talked about O-line play," Barone said in a session with media members. "From the day that I got hired, we were always watching tape together, and he was asking me that, with my background, 'How did you handle this situation or this look?' He and I were on the same page quite a bit no matter what, which makes it a lot more helpful."

Barone and Janocko each said they've enjoyed working with the other and look forward to continuing the effort.

"I've known Andrew now for a vear-and-a-half." Barone said. "We've been in the same room working with Tony, doing the game plan and things like that and doing drills. There's not many hiccups out there."

Janocko said: "Clancy is a great guy. He has a lot of experience in this league, he has a Super Bowl ring, so we're going forward.

"We've planned everything out, we've talked everything through and whatever comes up, we come to a decision and go with it with one message," Janocko added. "That's been the key thing so far. There's two voices, but there's one message. It's been great working with him because he's a good guy. a good football coach and he's passionate about what he does."

Janocko said he wants to carryover the approach he witnessed in Sparano, to "trust what you know, and then just go out and have fun with it."

"It's still football, it's still a lot of fun, and these guys are passionate, and to be passionate about what you're doing and teaching," Janocko added. "It's the one thing Tony, every day, no matter what, he had a passion for what he was doing, and that's something that I always want to mimic."

year after year in the NFL as players shuffle in and out of each organization in the offseason.

It was no different for the Vikings in 2018, although the added pieces that are now in Minnesota certainly bring more excitement and anticipation than usual.

The biggest offseason addition is undoubtedly quarterback Kirk Cousins.

The Vikings signed the Pro Bowl quarterback to a three-year contract in mid-March, snagging the top free agent prize of the NFL offseason, before Cousins quickly and confidently asserted himself as a leader in his new locker room and on the field.

"I think, that was my question coming in, 'How long do I sit back and watch and listen and learn before I start to act like a starting quarterback?' I was surprised by how much my teammates gave me that license to lead quickly," Cousins said a few weeks ago. "I thought they were going to want to have me prove myself a little bit longer than maybe I had to.

"They were very supportive. They said, 'No, man, it's your show, let's go.' So, when I say I was welcomed by the team, I was accepted, I was given permission to lead,"

Cousins added. "That's where it didn't take as long as maybe I thought it would have. That's been a pleasant surprise."

Cousins, a former fourth-round pick in 2012 out of Michigan State, threw for 13,176 yards and 81 touchdowns while compiling a passer rating of 97.6 in the past three seasons as Washington's starter. He has thrown for at least 4,000 yards and 25 touchdowns in each of the previous three seasons.

It's safe to say he's made a big impression on his new teammates and has gotten on the same page with skill players such as Stefon Diggs, Adam Thielen and Kyle Rudolph.

"Kirk has a lot going on in the offense and just commanding the offense, but Kirk is social with all his guys. He talks to everybody on the team," said Vikings running back Dalvin Cook. "If I want to ask a question, I go straight to Kirk. He's the captain of the ship, so I go straight to him. He answers me with all ears open, and we're just building from here."

Cousins will work with new Vikings Offensive Coordinator John DeFilippo, who joined the franchise after winning a Super Bowl LII ring as Philadelphia's quarterbacks coach in 2017. The Vikings

also signed multiple wide receivers. Kendall Wright led Chicago with 59 catches for 614 yards in 2017, and Brandon Zylstra, a Minnesota native, had 100 catches for 1,687 yards in the Canadian Football League.

Minnesota also added offensive newcomers in the draft, selecting offensive tackle Brian O'Neill (second round) and tight end Tyler Conklin (fifth round).

If Cousins was the big fish that Vikings General Manager Rick Spielman and the front office landed on offense, then defensive tackle Sheldon Richardson was the splashy signing on defense.

Richardson, the 13th overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft by the New York Jets, adds another weapon on a defense that ranked first in the NFL in yards allowed (275.9 per game), points allowed (15.8 per game) and on third downs (25.2 percent conversion rate allowed) in 2017.

Richardson spent the first four seasons of his career with the Jets before playing for the Seahawks in 2017. He has 19 career sacks in 73 career games.

"He's got great quickness. So far, Sheldon has played the run very, very well," said Vikings Head Coach Mike Zimmer. "We're working on some things [with his] pass rush because he's always been a guy that's been disruptive, he can get around the quarterback, but he hasn't finished. So we've been working on a lot of things with him.

"He's got excellent quickness, is strong; he's been good in the locker room and good on the field," Zimmer added.

Minnesota used its first-round pick on a player who could help out in multiple phases of the game.

Mike Hughes was the 30th overall selection in the 2018 NFL Draft and is looking to make an impact on defense and special teams.

The rookie has lined up at cornerback in training camp and the preseason, but he is also a candidate for kickoff and punt returns, an area Hughes excelled at in college. Hughes had a punt return for a touchdown and added two kickoff returns for scores in 2017 at UCF.

"I see potential for Mike Hughes doing anything he wants to in this game," said Vikings Special Teams Coordinator Mike Priefer. "He's very talented, he's very intelligent. He's very quiet and unassuming ... but there's a drive in there that you can see.

"I've been around a lot of young people, and I think he's one of the guys that really understands what he needs to do to get better," Priefer added. "He knows he hasn't arrived yet, even though he was a first-round draft pick. I love his attitude, I love his effort, and he's improving every day."

The Vikings went 13-3, won the NFC North and advanced to the NFC title game in 2017. But the hope is that the offseason additions will help Minnesota climb even higher this season.

"A big selling point here, to be honest with you, is not only the commitment the ownership has shown to giving us the resources necessary to win, but I had a lot of long talks with [players] about what this coaching staff does with players," Spielman said. "Coach Zim's history of taking guys that were first rounders – and this coaching staff is very unique because they can take players that are very good players, but somehow have the ability to take them to the next level.

"We anticipate, and we talked about this, 'You come in and listen to the coaches, and they will get you to where they want you to go," " Spielman added.




HAS LANDED AMONG LEGENDS

The wide receiver known as 'The SuperFreak' was enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton Ohio, on Aug. 4. He delivered an impassioned and emotional speech that lasted just under 17 minutes.

Moss, who ranks second alltime with 156 career receiving touchdowns and is fourth in league history with 15,292 receiving yards, spoke about his faith, family and his playing days during his speech. Here are five moments from Moss' speech.



DENNIS GREEN

Moss' career started in Minnesota in 1998 when the Vikings and former head coach Dennis Green drafted the wide receiver in the first round.

Moss paid homage to Green, who likely would have presented the Vikings Ring of Honor member at his induction ceremony. Green passed away on July 22, 2016.

"First and foremost, I have to give the credit to where it's due." Moss said. "Where would we be without Dennis Green? Where would the real Minnesota Vikings, Randy Moss true fans be if Dennis Green would have never pulled that trigger with the 21st pick?

"I want to thank all the true Minnesota Vikings fans for being able to stick with me through thick and thin, ups and downs, bumpy roads," Moss added. "This is for us."

CELEBRATE YOU'

Moss spent the first portion of his speech paying tribute to his family, a group that included his wife and kids as well as nieces and nephews.

But his most powerful tribute went to his mother, whom he credited for showing him what a hard work ethic during his youth.

"Momma, if they're here celebrating me for all of my accomplishments, they need to celebrate you," Moss said. "Being able to work two or three jobs to provide for us, you took care of us.

"For her to understand what this jacket means to me ... 'Momma, it was not about me.' I had to go get it for us," Moss added.

Moss closed his speech with a statement to his mother that he considers them both of Hall of Famers.

"Maxine Patricia Moss ... WE are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame!" Moss exclaimed.



### HE TOOK THE PARTY TO RAND, WV

Moss took the celebration home to West Virginia.

Moss announced during his speech that he would be back in his hometown of Rand the next day to hold a party for those who still live in his community.

Moss recalled his tough childhood in Rand, citing poverty and racism as issues that he often dealt with.

But he added that those experiences in the small town shaped him into the Hall of Famer he is today.

"Believe me when I tell you all, where I come from, I knew I had to carry you all," Moss said. "From the bottom of my heart, I know a lot of people out there are struggling.

"I cannot forget my small, unincorporated community of Rand, West Virginia," Moss added.

# ALL ABOUT 11

Moss set numerous individual records during his career, including catching a rookie-record 17 touchdowns in 1998, a mark that still stands today. He also set the single-season record with 23 touchdown catches in 2007 while with New England.

But the man with nine doubledigit touchdown seasons and 10 1,000-yard seasons said he never cared much for the individual accolades.

Toward the end of his speech, Moss recognized all of the people that he saw on a daily basis throughout his 14-vear NFL career.

"All of those individual awards don't really mean anything to me," Moss said. "It's a team sport. Football is a team sport.

"If you checked your pride at the door and are not ashamed ... all my teammates, coaches, equipment managers, trainers - if you're in attendance today – I want to thank vou because it doesn't take one. it takes all 11 of us," Moss added. "For all my teammates that I just talked about ... man, stand up. Stand up right now. There is not one ... it's 11."

Moss was inducted into the Vikings Ring of Honor at halftime of the Vikings 2017 season opener at U.S Bank Stadium.


The wide receiver thanked the Wilf family for their leadership as owners of the team and for making Moss feel like a part of the Vikings family once again.



WHEN THE VIKINGS VISITED Friendly Hills Middle School as part of the organization's "Team Up to Give Back" volunteer day in May, friends Hamza Mohamed, 11, and Bjorn Aune, 12, chatted in anticipation about whether or not they might get the chance to meet wide receiver Stefon Diggs.

"We were coming back up from outside and saw Stefon Diggs walking in, and I said, 'He's the G.O.A.T. - Greatest of All Time," said Bjorn, who along with other classmates explained the acronym to Vikings Owner Zygi Wilf.

At that exact moment and completely unprompted, Diggs walked through the classroom door.
