



# AT SEAHAWKS

The Vikings fought hard in the fourth quarter but fell short against the Seahawks in a 37-30 loss in Week 13 on Monday Night Football.

A strong first half gave way to a trouble-filled third quarter that kept Minnesota from winning its third consecutive game.

#### 01

Anthony Harris intercepted a Russell Wilson pass that was tipped at the line of scrimmage by rookie Armon Watts and batted by Wilson. Harris returned the football 20 yards for his first career pick-six.

#### 02

Kyle Rudolph secured a 3-yard touchdown pass from Kirk Cousins with his left hand. It was Rudolph's fourth consecutive game with at least one score.

#### 03

Stefon Diggs rushed for a career-long 27 yards on a sweep during Minnesota's first possession. The run set up a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Dalvin Cook.






Ifeadi Odenigbo sacked

Cousins tried to rally an offense that was without Cook and left tackle Riley Reiff in the second half. He finished 22-of-38 passing for 276 yards with two scores and an interception on a deflection. The pick ended a franchise-record stretch of 202 consecutive attempts without an interception.

Laquon Treadwell found an opening in the defense, and Cousins connected with him on a 58-yard touchdown pass that gave Minnesota a spark in the fourth quarter.

# Today's game is the 117th meeting between the Detroit Lions and Minnesota Vikings.

Minnesota holds a 75-39-2 edge, having recorded more wins against Detroit than any other opponent. The franchises have met twice each season, except in the strikeshortened 1982 campaign.

The Vikings are aiming for their fifth

consecutive win, a streak that began with a 30-23 victory by Minnesota on Thanksgiving Day in 2017.

Since then, the Vikings have outscored the Lions 93 to 48, which includes a 42-30 decision in the Motor City on Oct. 20. The teams have been on different trajectories since Week 5. Minnesota has claimed six victories in eight games, and Detroit has dropped seven of eight since its bye.

# LB ERIC KENDRICKS

THE SECRET TO THE OUTSIDE WORLD – Eric Kendricks is good and Pro Bowl worthy – is starting to spread. Kendricks entered Week 14 with the second-highest grade of any linebacker (90.9) by Pro Football Focus in 2019. That trails only Denver's Alexander Johnson (91.1). Kendricks leads the Vikings and all NFL linebackers with 12 pass breakups this season, setting a career high and tying a team record set by Matt Blair in 1981 and equaled by Ben Leber in 2008. The Vikings have credited Kendricks with 113 tackles on the season, and the league has those numbers at 96, bringing his career total to 518, which is sixth in the NFL since 2015. Take note of the ways that Kendricks shows his expertise within the Vikings defense and the way he connects all levels of the defense and delivers impact plays. # WR MARVIN JONES, JR.

MARVIN JONES, JR., HAS CAUSED THE VIKINGS plenty of problems before and after joining the Lions in 2016. Although he had just one game against Minnesota while with Cincinnati, the California native totaled six catches for 85 yards in 2013. Jones has played six games against the Vikings since becoming a Lion and has had six or more catches in each of the past three meetings, totaling 22 receptions for 278 yards (12.6 yards per catch) and six scores in that span. In Week 7, Jones, Jr., racked up a career-high 10 receptions for 93 yards on 13 targets. He also matched his career best with four receiving touchdowns on the day. Jones, Jr., led NFL receiving qualifiers with a per-catch average of 18.0 yards in 2017. He enters today's game with 59 receptions on 84 targets for a catch percentage of 70.2 that is by far the highest of his career, but his yards per catch of 12.6 is tied for the second-lowest of his career.

But he wasn't a big fan of the team.
"I never grew up a Lions fan ... more of a
Tigers fan," Wilson said. "More just fans
of good players ... a lot of respect for Barry
Sanders and Calvin Johnson."

Now in his third season with the Vikings, Wilson has made seven career starts – with three of them against the Lions.

He started both games against Detroit in 2018 and was also a starter in Week 7 of the 2019 season when the Vikings earned a 42-30 win. (Wilson has made six of his seven starts against NFC North opponents).

"I was just excited. Excited to be out there, especially in my hometown," Wilson said of the games he's started in Detroit. "I had about 30 people there, just family and friends watching. I was just excited to go make plays."

"I think last year I started both Lions games and both Bears games," Wilson added. "Those are big, important games – division games – and it was great to get experience in those."

Wilson said he likes how his game has improved since arriving as an undrafted free agent from the University of Cincinnati in the spring of 2017.

But he also emphasized the importance of providing depth for the Vikings defense at a moment's notice.

"I think I've been doing a good job. I've been steadily trying to get better in any way that I can," Wilson said. "Just improve on the details and the fundamentals of the game. Those are important, especially at this time of the year.

"And anywhere you look, you have to have guys ready to play and step up," Wilson added. "Even if it's only for one play, or for a whole game, you have to be ready and know the game plan even if you're not listed as starting that week. You have to know all the intricacies and stay ready during the week."

Wilson has 4.0 sacks in his career, two of which came in Week 3 against Oakland in September. Another occurred against the Bears in Week 11 of the 2018 season.

The fourth, naturally, happened at Ford Field against the Lions in Week 16 last season.

A: "I didn't get the sponsorship. Last year, too, I got smashed in the face and had an Under Armour imprint on my face. I didn't get a sponsorship from that, either. I don't know what's going on with these visor sponsorships ... I need to talk to them."

1 noticed you have the Wilson Sporting Goods logo tattooed inside of a football on your left chest. What's the story behind that?

A: "I got that back when I was 16 or 17, in high school. I thought it was pretty unique that dang near every football had Wilson on it. That is one of my passions, so why not put that on and represent? It's on my left chest, along with my football numbers over the top of it."

Is that every number you've worn?

\*That I've worn so far for a good period of time. I was a couple different numbers in high school, but the number I was most was 11. And then 23 was my number in college. I don't have 50 [tattooed] yet, though."

Time for the most serious question on here.
We all know Lizzo sings about the "new man on the Minnesota Vikings" in her song "Truth

Hurts." She recently said he is from the Detroit area. You are from the Detroit area ... is it you?



# DANIELLE HUNTER IS QUIETLY BUT QUICKLY TAKING THE NEL BY STORM.

Hunter's 49.5 sacks entering today's game rank as the third-most by a player in his first five seasons with the Vikings, trailing only Jared Allen (74) and Keith Millard (51). And now, he stands poised to be the youngest player in league history to record 50 QB takedowns.

True to form, Hunter humbly credits those around him for helping him reach milestone after milestone thus far.

He's grateful to those who believed in him.

"When I came in, I'm pretty sure not many people expected me to do what I'm doing right now. But I couldn't control that," Hunter said. "The only way I can control what people think is by going out on the field and applying what I've learned."

As he approaches a benchmark that hasn't before been reached, I sat down with the defensive end and asked him to go through a list of his favorite career sacks thus far.

#### First Solo Sack | Jay Cutler | Nov. 1, 2015

**Situation:** Third-and-3 | 4:27 Q1 | Beat RT Kyle Long and cut up the middle to take down Cutler

It was a good feeling. ... It's kind of one of those things where you expect it to be either Griff' (Everson Griffen), B-Rob (Brian Robison) or Tom [Johnson] with the sack, and then I ended up getting it."

#### First Sack at U.S. Bank Stadium Aaron Rodgers | Sept. 18, 2016

**Situation:** Third-and-7 | 0:44 Q1 | Out-muscled Packers RT Bryan Bulaga for first career sack of Rodgers and forced a fumble recovered by LB Eric Kendricks

This was a memorable one.... That was actually the first sack in that stadium. That's why they've got the picture on the wall over there.... I was wondering why the photo was so significant. I think [Vikings Communications Manager Sam Newton] told me one day, [and] I was like, 'Cool.' That was pretty awesome."

#### Safety Down (NFC) South | Cam Newton | Sept. 25, 2016

**Situation:** Second-and-9 | 1:51 Q1 | Got past the Panthers left tackle and left guard to sniff out Newton in the Carolina end zone for a safety

(公 That was one of my top five sacks probably between my No. 1 and No. 2. ... I was going against Michael Oher, and I remember being star-struck by two people. Cam Newton, he was my idol in high school, so the game started, this was my first time going against the Panthers, and I was like, 'Man, that's Cam Newton.' And I'm like, 'Damn, this is Michael Oher, the quy [portrayed in] The Blindside.' I was at right end, and I quess I beat [Oher], and then there was another quy, the quard [Andrew Norwell], and I beat him, and Cam was right there, and I sacked him for a safety. That was pretty cool. And then Coach [Patterson] was like, 'Man, that safety that you got, that was big-time.' He was happy about that."

#### Ramming the Door Down | Jared Goff | Nov. 19, 2017

Situation: Third-and-10 | 2:31 Q1 | Hunter reached over the top of Rams RT Rob Havenstein to sack Goff for a loss of 9 before bringing out his "kick-the-door-down" celebration for the first time

- This is when I ran over the tackle. That was intense. I was like, 'Oh, man.' I couldn't go around him, I couldn't go [to the] inside of him, so just had to go through him.
- This is when I first did the little door thing.
  I almost kicked Griff' in the face because
  he was going to go in front of me."

# Q: I've heard you got the celebration idea from former Vikings RB Jerick McKinnon?

Yeah, he did it coming out of the tunnel, so I said, 'Ooh - I'm stealing this.'"

#### Gazelle-ing Garoppolo Jimmy Garoppolo | Sept. 9, 2018

**Situation:** First-and-10 | 1:24 Q3 | Gets around the outside of 49ers RT Garry Gilliam to take down Garoppolo from behind for a loss of 5

I like this one because sometimes I tend to do a leap. I don't know how I do it.

Sometimes I leap, and I'm like, 'Wow.' I don't even realize I do it. L.J. (Linval Joseph) is always the one to point that out to me, whenever I leap. He calls it 'gazelle-ing.'

He says I 'gazelle' the quarterback."

#### Sacking a Scrambler | Carson Wentz | Oct. 7. 2018

**Situation:** First-and-10 | 5:18 Q3 | Hunted down an on-the-move Wentz and managed to drop the powerful passer for a loss of 8

Wentz is pretty hard to get down ... I remember this one, I got to him and tried to swat at the ball, because I knew he was going to try to throw it while going down. He always does that. Whenever he's going down, he tries to do Superman stuff."

It's a screen. Sheldon got in his face and helped me out, and then I got that sack. ... Everybody was getting sacks. Everybody was happy after this game. This is when I got [a postgame call from Deion Sanders]; you know, 'When you ball, you get the call'? And I got [NFC] Defensive Player of the Week. It was pretty fun."

#### 40 in 4 | Ryan Tannehill | Dec. 16, 2018

**Situation:** Second-and-19 | 11:39 Q2 | Cut back inside and up the middle to reach Tannehill for a loss of 8, just one play after he was sacked by Anthony Barr

**Note:** Hunter recorded 2.0 sacks to reach 40 in his first four seasons, more than any other Viking in that time frame except for Jared Allen

I went on the inside right here. [Vikings DL Coach Andre Patterson] actually told me to do this. I told him, 'He's setting from my outside, outside,' and he's like, 'The next rush, go on the inside.' So I did exactly that, and then I got him.

#### Leaping at Lambeau Aaron Rodgers | Sept. 1<u>5, 2019</u>

**Situation:** Third-and-7 | 6:26 Q3 | Easily wins a 1-on-1 matchup with Packers TE Jimmy Graham, runs and leaps to sack Rodgers for a 10-yard loss

- Here it is. The leap. I got off the ball, beat the tight end. When we watched this in the room, everybody was laughing. L.J. was dying, and Stacy [Keely] was crying-dying. Because they say, 'It's the damn leap.' That was pretty funny. I didn't even realize I did that.
- It's always a good feeling when you get a sack against them, because their tackles are really good. The only reason why we have a chance is because he holds the ball. We go to our second move sometimes and win."

#### 48 by 25 | Case Keenum | Oct. 24, 2019

**Situation:** First-and-10 | 9:04 Q1 | Won his matchup with Redskins TE Hale Hentges to circle around and strip sack former teammate Case Keenum; fumble was recovered by DT Shamar Stephen

**Note:** Hunter set the NFL record for sacks before age 25 at 48. He celebrated his 25th birthday five days later.

The Vikings running back has already spent time this season at the Hennepin County Juvenile Detention Center. He also spent an afternoon at the Southside Boys & Girls Club in Minneapolis and is on the Vikings Social Justice Committee.

Abdullah's cleats will support the Black Youth Project, which aims to empower young African American. According to the Black Youth Project's website, the group focuses on "attitudes, resources and culture of African American youth ages 15 to 25." Abdullah said he hopes those impacted by the Black Youth Project will see his cleats and be inspired to "create and be more than what is expected of them."

"Just set a new standard for themselves every single day," Abdullah said. "I'm a guy who didn't come from much but has accomplished quite a bit in my young life.

"I feel like everyone has that opportunity, it's just how you apply yourself and apply your mind in certain circumstances," he added.

WHEN C.J. HAM LACED UP HIS CLEATS this morning, he felt a little extra motivation – and emotion – ahead of taking the field at U.S. Bank Stadium.

It's not because today's game is a divisional matchup and a hopeful bounce-back for Minnesota after a tough loss to Seattle on *Monday Night Football*.

Rather, C.J.'s custom-designed kicks for the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats game feature a portrait of his mother, Tina, who currently is fighting pancreatic cancer.

C.J. surprised Tina with the cleats after a recent Saturday morning walk-through. Sharing the first look, mother and son each were taken aback by the detail as they lifted the box's lid and picked up the shoes.

On one, Tina is painted with a wide smile and in Vikings gear, a photograph snapped before at the Crucial Catch game in October; **You are the strongest person in the world** is written in white across the toe. The other reads, **I love you, Mom**. A purple ribbon for pancreatic cancer wraps across the outside panel of each cleat.

"These are made specifically for you," C.J. told Tina. "I know you've been through a lot in this past year, and I just wanted to make these special for you."

"They're so cute," she said, breaking into a matching smile.

C.J.'s cleats represent the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network, which is dedicated to fighting "the world's toughest cancer" through research, clinical initiatives, patient services and advocacy.

Tina was diagnosed in March 2018 initially with Stage 2 pancreatic cancer, but surgery revealed that it actually was Stage 4.

C.J. has been inspired by his mother and felt strongly about dedicating today's game to her ongoing battle.

"With everything she's been through, staying strong this entire time, I just wanted to honor her," he explained. "I love my mom, and I just want to do all I can for her."

He gave Tina a hug and kiss and then was joined by his wife, Stephanie, and daughters, Skylar and Stella.

"That's Granny!" Skylar exclaimed excitedly, pointing to the portrait.

"It's way better than I even imagined. Words can't even really explain," C.J. said. "Just the portrait itself – there's so much strength in that picture.

"She truly is the strongest person I know, and I know when I'm wearing these cleats, it's going to help me," he added, his voice wavering.

As the family continued to admire the uniquely designed cleats, Tina reiterated how much she loved them.

"But I don't get to wear them," she said, laughing.

"No, you don't get to wear them," C.J. agreed with a smile. "But I get to wear them *for* you."

# BRIAN O'NEILL COMES FROM A TIGHT-KNIT FAMILY.

The 24-year-old is the youngest of four siblings and is honoring one of his sisters, Lorraine, 30, and Autism Speaks with his cleats.

Autism Speaks promotes solutions for the needs of individuals with autism and their families. The organization provides advocacy and support for people with autism and works to increase understanding and acceptance.

An estimated one-third of people with autism are nonverbal, including Lorraine, which prevents Brian from staying connected across the miles through phone calls.

"The only time I can [communicate] with her is when I'm at home, but I try to get back home as much as I can," he said. "It's a different relationship, but it's a unique one and a special one for sure."

Brian said Autism Speaks does "a lot of great things for a lot of people," and he appreciates the opportunity to increase awareness.

"I think the more that people do talk about autism and understand it, the better it is for the families who go through it because more people have an idea of what it's like," Brian said. "I hope that process of people learning and continuing to expand their knowledge continues."

#### SEAN MANNION

**TEAM GLEASON** 

**SEAN MANNION** will be wearing customized cleats for the first time in his NFL career. And he's picked a cause that is near and dear to him and his family.

The Vikings quarterback is honoring Team Gleason, an organization that supports those with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), a neuromuscular disease that causes neurons in muscles to die. Steve Gleason, a former player with the New Orleans Saints, was diagnosed with ALS in 2011.

"Anything I can do to bring attention to that and bring attention to what Steve is doing for people with ALS, it's the smallest gesture I can make," Mannion said. "I'm proud to be wearing these cleats."

Mannion's father-in-law, Mike Lopez, passed away in January of 2003 after being diagnosed with the disease in 1996. He was 49 years old.

Lopez was a defensive back at Oregon State from 1982 to 1985 and earned All-Pac-10 Conference honors as a senior in 1985 with six interceptions.

Mannion, who also played at Oregon State, later married Lopez's oldest daughter, Megan.

"I was only able to meet him once before he passed ... me and Megan had just started dating," Mannion said. "But he was just a really, really great guy. A great man.

"Just a great father to Megan and her sister. It's unfortunate I wasn't able to get to know him better. But I just know from the way Megan talks about him that he was a tremendous father."

Team Gleason has raised more than \$10 million for ALS research and support since 2011.

signed up for a Humane Society event to help change the lives of animals. What he didn't realize, however, is how

much those animals would change his life. Harris joined Vikings teammates in November 2018 as a way to draw more community members into the animal shelter and promote animal adoption. While there, something caught his eye.

Harris noticed a kitten interacting playfully with a woman before crawling up onto her shoulders and lying down across her coat's large collar.

When Harris inquired about the cat, he was told by a shelter staff member that she had recently been adopted by the woman, but one of their other cats had a similar personality.

"The lady pulled [Ella] out. She was sleeping, so I was like, 'I don't know if her personality is how I like,' but once they woke her up, she was super into me, and I was like, 'All right, she's social.' "Harris recalled with a smile.

He reserved the tabby mix and planned to pick her up a few days later. Unfortunately, Harris was notified that Ella had been exposed to an illness that, if she contracted it. would likely be fatal.

While the shelter held Ella for observation, Harris was introduced to a dark gray-and-cream-colored Siamese mix, Cookie, whom he decided to adopt in the meantime. Then he received a phone call that Ella

would be OK, and he faced a decision.

"I kind of felt bad," Harris said. "I really liked Ella, and I was like, 'You know, I don't know if I want two cats yet. I've only had one for a week.' But then I started talking to people who had cats, and they were saying they're better in twos, and I thought it would be pretty neat just to have somebody to play with. So I went back, picked her up, and they've been hanging since.

"They didn't have a great relationship [starting out]," Harris added with a laugh. "They both looked at each other and had their backs up, they kind of made a little fighting noise, and I was like, 'Hey! Ya'll gotta figure it out, or somebody's gotta go back.' So I gave them a couple of days, and they adjusted. Now they cuddle on each other and lick on each other and all that other cat stuff."

Cookie and Ella are happy and comfortable in their forever home.

The two felines dash daily around Harris' Minneapolis apartment, hiding beneath and behind furniture, playing with their toys and climbing the cat scratch tower.

And like the "siblings" they are, Cookie and Ella's personality differences are less than subtle.

While Ella will hurry to introduce herself to a visitor, Cookie scurries to the darkness of a nearby bedroom. Harris describes Ella "like a little kid."

"She wakes up early, and she'll cry at the door, and she knows how to get in. She just puts her paw in there and opens it up," Harris

said. "Ella is super social. She likes me to pick her up and hold her.

"And then the Siamese, Cookie, she's kind of like a little diva," he continued. "She's the one that everybody sees and [wants to pick her up] – and she lets you hold her for a while, then she just jumps down."

Both cats will lie on Harris' lap, but he chuckles at what he believes to be their different motivations for affection: "Ella enjoys the company. Cookie uses me as a pillow."

Harris doesn't shy away from showing off the cats that have become a big part of his life. In fact, they have their own Instagram account, @hooscoolcats. with more than 3.300 followers.

Harris initially posted about them on his own account, @hoosdatdude, and joked that people more enjoyed the photos of the cats than of the NFL safety.

"I had a few people who have literally commented out of humor – and maybe some seriousness – 'Hey, I'm just here to see the cats,' " Harris said. "So, I kind of wanted to give the people what they wanted and made them an [Instagram account].

"I try to post about them equally. I try to be a good parent and not have any biased opinions about them or treat them differently," he added with a smile.

Not everyone is a cat lover, though, and Harris admitted that he gets ribbed on a regular basis by some of his teammates, particularly dog owners.

"It's like, 'What kind of guy gets a cat,

man?' " Harris said. "Or if we're in the weight room or something and they're talking about who's stronger, it's like, 'He's not stronger than me' or 'He's not faster than me – he's got cats.' Stuff like that."

But he also proudly added that there's been an increase of intrigue from teammates about cat ownership.

"I'm not going to say it has anything to do with me and my two cats, but that's just what I've been getting," Harris said. "I always recommend, 'You should get your cat from an animal shelter, because that way you change a cat's life.'"

Harris is grateful that he chose pet adoption, even though it wasn't something he initially planned.

And if you ask him, he now has the perfect pair of pets.

"I like the fact that, together, they're not too overwhelming. The fact that [Ella] craves a lot of attention and [Cookie] doesn't, it's nice for me. Having both of them on my lap at the same time can get a little heavy," Harris quipped.

"When I get home and put my feet up and am on the couch, I feel bad when I fall asleep, they're sleeping on me, and then I wake up and [startle them] and they don't know what's going on," he continued.

Harris paused to look down at Ella, cuddling in his arms, and at Cookie, chasing a beam of light on the floor: "They kind of balance each other out."

# RED COX

1938-2019



The life of Fred Cox —
affectionately referred to
as "Freddy the Foot" by Vikings
fans and lovingly known as a
husband, father, brother and uncle
— was celebrated during a
funeral service last month at
Buffalo Covenant Church.

Former teammates attended the ceremony, along with friends that met Cox well after his 15 seasons in Purple that landed him among the 50 Greatest Vikings.

Cox, who passed away on Nov. 20, is the franchise's all-time leading scorer with 1,365 points. To put that in perspective, he has 62 more career points than the next two Vikings — Cris Carter (670) and Ryan Longwell (633) — combined.

A native of Monongahela, Pennsylvania, Cox was inducted to the Ringgold High School sports hall of fame in 2006 along with Joe Montana, Stan Musial and Ken Griffey, Sr. Cox enjoyed a successful chiropractic

business that he launched while a member of the Vikings, and he also happened to co-invent the NERF football, an innovation that has helped youth connect with the sport at early ages.

But for those who were able to attend, it was crystal-clear that Cox's commitments to his Christian faith and family were never compromised by football, fame or fortune. He used athletics to reach others by helping launch the Minnesota chapter of Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Here are three excerpts from an interview with Cox from 2018 (visit Vikings.com for his full story on the NERF football):

# Q: I don't know of too many kickers who can say they've had a Hall of Fame snapper and holder.

A: "Not many of them. You probably haven't met many kickers, either, that only had one guy that ever snapped a ball to him in 15 years. Mick Tingelhoff was the only guy that ever snapped the ball that I kicked. Paul Krause held every ball for 10 years, and the other five, Francis [Tarkenton] held. I had three Hall of Fame guys – how do you think they got there? "I tell Paul that all of the time: 'Man,

"I tell Paul that all of the time: 'Man you'd have never gotten in if you hadn't held for me.' "

# Q: What was it like when the Vikings finally put everything together in 1969?

A: "You have to look at Bud [Grant] for a lot of the stuff that made this team jell. He knew how to get the most out of players better than any coach I ever knew. He just had that ability to know what each guy needed. Some guys needed a push, and some guys needed an arm on their shoulder."

#### Q: What type of guy were you?

A: "I was a guy that just needed to be left alone, and he knew that. ... I can still remember his [first] year here, we were playing Detroit, and I missed three field goals in a row and then made one. After the game, I was sitting in front of my locker and throwing things in it – not gently. He walked over, put his arm around me and said, 'Bet you've never had a game like that before.' Now that was Bud Grant. He turned around and walked away. That was all he said."

### MINNESOTA HIGH SCHOOLS PROVIDE EARLY PLAYERS

The Vikings currently have two homegrown players — Adam Thielen and C.J. Ham — who starred on high school fields here before advancing to college and their home-state NFL team.

Ham's alma mater, Denfeld High School in Duluth, was one of several that supplied players to the Minneapolis Marines (1921-24), Duluth Kelleys (1923-25), Duluth Eskimos (1926-27) or Minneapolis Marines (1929-30) in the NFL's first decade.

According to pro-football-reference.com, Denfeld had five alumni that were involved with those teams, including Dewey Scanlon, who was a head coach for the Kelleys (5-1 in 1924, 0-3 in 1925), Eskimos (6-5-3) and Chicago Cardinals (6-6-1 in 1929) and appeared in one game in 1926. Scanlon is pictured below.

Russ Method (1923-25 Kelleys, 1926-27 Eskimos, 1929 Chicago Cardinals), Dick O'Donnell (1923 Kelleys, 1924-30 Green Bay Packers, 1931 Brooklyn Dodgers), Wally Gilbert (1923-25 Kelleys, 1926 Eskimos) and Bill McNelis (1927 Eskimos) also attended Denfeld High School.

Duluth Central provided seven players, and Duluth Cathedral provided six to Minnesota's early NFL teams. Minneapolis Central and Two Harbors each had four alums that played professionally in state, and Roosevelt in Virginia supplied three (brothers Bill, Joe and Cobb Rooney).

# **COMMUNITY CAPTAINS**

Kirk Cousins made sure he got a selfie with everybody who made the trek from Detroit Lakes.

Xavier Rhodes jokingly proposed a pillow fight, and Harrison Smith double-checked to make sure there was no "bad blood" between schools before hopping in a group photo with five players from different high school programs who were named 2019 Vikings Community Captains in a special surprise last month at U.S. Bank Stadium.

The five players - Carson DeKam (Owatonna), Spencer Ell (Bethlehem Academy), Gabe Hanninen (Detroit Lakes), Jovan Northington (Edison) and Hunter Zenzen (Barnesville) - were told they had been selected for a tour of the venue that's in its fourth season as the Vikings home.

Moments after the five high school players were informed of their selection as Community Captains, they were led into the locker room where Cousins, Rhodes and Smith were waiting, along with personalized lockers with footballs and customized cleats.

Jaws dropped, and thoughts perhaps intended to be internal were whispered.

"It's surreal, walking in and seeing all of them there," said Zenzen, who has played in multiple prep games at U.S. Bank Stadium and is committed to play at Iowa State. "It was a moment of awe."

DeKam also used "surreal" to describe the meet-and-greet and set-up in the locker room.

"I didn't expect Vikings players to be here ... I was watching the Vikes [the previous day] and now I'm meeting some of the guys," DeKam said. "Wow, it's amazing."

The five then found out they'd be receiving free Sleep Number 360° smart beds, the same type that Cousins, Rhodes and Smith credit for improving their sleep.

"The opportunity to recognize these student athletes that do a great job as leaders on and off the field is such a great fit for us as a company," Sleep Number Vice President of Brand Partnerships Patrick Campion said. "A big push for us is improving the well-being of youth through better sleep, so this is perfect. We're bringing together our partnership with the Vikings and that commitment to youth.

"It's great that they can see an example from people like Kirk, Xavier and Harrison

that wellness matters, and having them learn the habits at this age, they'll understand that as they [progress] past high school and college, this is going to help them, no matter what they do. If they're still playing sports or have a job, they'll have more energy, and learning these habits right now is great for them."

The prep stars were able to chat with the pros on a variety of topics, ranging from the importance of getting good rest, to the atmosphere on game days and the grind in between.

"It's a thrill to meet them. They're such sharp kids," Cousins said. "I see myself in them, being high school football players and having so much ahead of them. It's great to honor these kids and celebrate the way that they've carried themselves throughout the years and the way they've made a difference in their schools and communities. They should be honored in this way. It was great to see them light up when they saw their names on the lockers and the custom cleats.

"I enjoy talking to young people because I feel like I've walked where they are walking right now and where they're going to walk," he added. "I would just say, 'Stay humble and stay hungry, keep working and good things will happen.' Adversity is going to be part of the journey. I'm sure they've already faced some."

Cousins pointed out that Northington was in a walking boot but showing "great spirit."

"It feels good because to hear that from people like him," Northington said. "It's like, 'Wow, that's stand-up.' People recognize the presence I bring, so that's a good feeling."

Smith said he enjoyed the opportunity to thank the high school players for being great people in their communities. The interaction, he said, was one of mutual admiration.

"It's something that you can sometimes forget, kind of how great it is to be playing in the NFL and playing for an organization like the Vikings," Smith said. "In your daily grind, you're watching film and getting ready for the next opponent. Sometimes you lose sight of those things, so you try to be a role model for the people looking up to us but also appreciate them for what they're doing."

The three Vikings are part of a locker room that continuously commits to supporting young people in a variety of ways. Rhodes said he's become more involved over the course of his time with the Vikings and that he is excited to see the young people so dedicated at an early age.

"I can remember when I was in high school, I wasn't thinking like that until I became an NFL player and realized the true meaning of being a football player and how big football is to some people," Rhodes said. "I feel honored to be around these kids because they're great kids, willing to help and put others before themselves and realize how big of a platform they have."

Cousins said he began taking his sleep "seriously" about five years ago and "it's made a big difference."

Most nights, he aims for nine hours of sleep and said doing so helps him go through all that he must process to prepare each week and within the game.

"Because I'm always thinking, I need nine hours of sleep. Once I'm up and going, the engines are revving," Cousins said.






day is being around all of the people, saying, "It puts a smile on my face every game day!"


